No, you're not going to be allowed to go out on your own; you'll go in convoy through the mountain roads and canyons, following the lead car driven by one of Oxotic's instructors. The rides last 15 miles, 30 miles, 60 miles or 120 miles, and 30 should be your minimum; it lasts about an hour. On the longer runs, you'll get to switch between 4 or 5 different supercars. They have an incredible stable of cars, and it's the most fun you can have. I can't recommend it highly enough.
